

On 1/14/2023, Shelby American commemorated the 100th anniversary of its founder's birth in the most Carroll Shelby way it can. That means a hot-rod version of the 2023 Mustang GT, supercharged to make 750 horsepower, barking exhaust fumes out of the Borla cat-back exhaust system. Fittingly, Shelby American is only planning to make 100 of the centennial editions. Unfortunately, they all sold out in the four days since a prototype was displayed in Gardena, California.

The "Hidden Pioneers" were a big part of the Carroll Shelby Centennial Birthday Celebration. Among the guests were Aaron Shelby, Carroll's Grandson, and Gary Patterson, President of Shelby American. They attended to talk with

some of the Hidden Pioneers and met some students, turned Technicians. Representatives from NASA spoke and set up an exhibit. Everyone listened to the History and legacy of a great Man, who loved cars & racing.

FORD MODEL T "THE GAME CHANGER"

Although automobiles were being produced starting in the 1880s, they were mostly scarce, expensive, and often unreliable. When the Model T was introduced in 1908 it was Henry Ford's dream for it to be a car for the ordinary man throughout the US and the world. It was to be reliable and durable, easy to drive, maintain, and repair. It must be able to cope with the worst roads and it must not cost more than \$500. The Model Ts success in these regards is legendary

When the Model T was debuted on October 1, 1908, it broke new ground and marked the beginning of mass car culture. Ford had already cut manufacturing costs by standardizing the vehicle and its parts. The Model T, also

known as the "Tin Lizzie" or "Flivver, was famously available in any color the customer wanted, so long as it was black. Henry knew to achieve his goal of a car for the masses, he would need to speed up the manufacturing process.

To achieve that goal, between 1908 and 1913 the company replaced expensive, time-consuming handcrafting with a "moving assembly-line" production at its Highland Park Plant north of Detroit. This is where conveyor systems were to installed to bring every component and part to the chassis as moved along the final assembly line. Henry Ford didn't invent the assembly line, versions of which had been used in meat processing, the manufacture of, clocks, bicycles and other products, as well as by the Olds Motor Vehicle Company. Ford's contribution was to improve the system by combining technological advances with the already established conveyor belt system to make the assembly process far more efficient. The specialization of the assembly line meant that Ford no longer had to use craftsmen and could instead



hire low-skill workers and teach them a few simple steps. Most critically, the assembly line cut the amount of time it took to assemble a Model T from 12.5 hours to just 93 minutes.

The assembly line drove the Model T's remarkable success for many years, but it wouldn't last. Henry Ford long had stubbornly refused any major remake of his prized Model T but was finally convinced a change was



necessary by lagging sales to his competitors. They were offering advancements in their vehicles which made the model T outdated. On May 26, 1927, Henry Ford watched the 15 millionth Model T Ford roll off the assembly line at his factory in Highland Park, Michigan

ENTER THE A. Henry Ford built a series of cars between 1903 and the introduction of the Model T in 1908. Ford named his first car the Model A and proceeded through the alphabet up to the Model T, twenty models in all. The follow-up to the Model T was another Ford Model A, rather than the "Model U." The company publicity said this was because the new car was such a departure from the old that Ford wanted to start all over again with the letter A.


